# PRELUDE BELLS ANNOUNCEMENTS

## **CALL TO WORSHIP**

P: Today, we are giving thanks to God for the gift of mothers and the mother-like nurture that many people show to others in their lives.

R1: Isaiah wrote that God is a mother to us, comforting and carrying us in her arms:

R2: *"As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you...."* (Isa. 66:13) **Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.** 

R1: Isaiah also wrote that God would never forget us. He knows each of us, like a mother knows her own children:

R2: *"Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you!"* (Isa. 49:15)

Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.

R1: David wrote that in God's presence, he was quiet and at peace, trusting his mother God like a child safe in loving arms:

R2: "But I have stilled and quietened my soul; like a weaned child with its mother, like a weaned child is my soul within me." (Ps. 131:2)

### Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.

R1: Jesus spoke of himself as a mother, longing to wrap his arms around us, like a mother hen gathers her chicks under her wings:


R2: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem...how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were no willing." (Matt. 23:37)

Loving Lord, thank you for your tender care.

R1: Paul writes about his missionary ministry and likens his work to that of a nurse who looks after those in her care:

R2: *"...but we were gentle among you, like a mother caring for her little children."* (1 Thess. 2:7)
