

### INTRODUCTION



RESPONSE TO THE WORD

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

*Luther's Explanation to the Apostle's Creed*

The articles will be read by our Confirmation Students. At the end of each article the congregation will respond: **This is most certainly true.**

**The First Article: On Creation**

I believe that God has created me together with all that exists. God has given me and still preserves my body and soul: eyes, ears, and all limbs and senses; reason and all mental faculties.

In addition, God daily and abundantly provides shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and farm, spouse and children, fields, livestock, and all property; along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life. God protects me against all danger and shields and preserves me from all evil.

And all this is done out of pure, fatherly, and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness of mine at all! For all of this I owe it to God to thank and praise, serve and obey him.

**This is most certainly true.**

**The Second Article: On Redemption**

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father in eternity, and also a true human being, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord. He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned human being. He has purchased and freed me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death. He has done all this in order that I may belong to him, live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in eternal righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as he is risen from the dead and lives and rules eternally.

**This is most certainly true.**

**The Third Article: On Being Made Holy**

I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins—mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life.

**This is most certainly true.**

Gather those who are suffering, and make well-being and salvation take root in their lives. Bring hope to those who are sick or suffering in any way today (*especially*). Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Pour out your Spirit on this assembly through word, water, bread, and wine. Continually reshape us to be a community of welcome for people from near and far. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

*Here other intercessions may be offered.*

Let your grace be made known through the witness of saints who share your good news (*like the apostles Simon and Jude, whom we commemorate today*). Increase our faith until your word flows freely from us. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Enfold all things in your compassion, O God, and bring us into your life through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**
