Nicene Creed

Here at the Lake Mills Food Shelf, we are kicking off our Share the Joy program. This includes our Christmas Food Basket giveaway. I thought I would share some details for those who wish to become involved ...



Each Christmas the Lake Mills Area Ministerial Association with the help of an area 4H chapter pack Christmas Food Baskets for area families who are food insecure. The baskets include such food items as a ham or turkey, stuffing mix, pumpkin pie filling and pie crusts, a selection of canned vegetables, a 5# bag of potatoes, a bag of carrots, a bag of onions, a bag of oranges, a dozen fresh eggs, butter or margarine, in addition families also receive such items as: soups, canned fruit, cereal, pasta and pasta sauce, peanut butter, canned meals, like chili and beef stew, rice, crackers, a bag of sugar or flour, and a gallon of milk to name just some of the items included in each Christmas Food Basket.
