Genesis 18:14

Salem Lutheran Church Council Minutes – December 8, 2014

President Harris Honsey called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM. Members present were Harris Honsey, Scott Hagenson, Mike Swenson, Deb Throne, Yvonne Beenken, Karla Eaton, Allison Rice, Keith Johnson, and Pastor Soli. Pastor Soli opened the meeting with devotions. It was moved by Deb, with a second by Mike, to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. All approved.

Secretary's Report: There was one piece of correspondence from Lutheran Disaster Relief and Hunger Appeal acknowledging a donation.

Treasurer's Report: Mike reported a checking account balance of \$38,841.91. He reminded the Council that we have additional funds held in a money market account. Total income for November was \$46,711.18 and total expenses were \$27,494.74. The Finance Committee will meet on December 15 to discuss the budget for 2015. Wednesday night meals have been attended by an average of 43 people each week. The meals no longer operate at a loss. It was moved by Scott and seconded by Keith to accept this report. All approved.

Financial Secretary's Report: Deb reported an increase in giving in November. Total giving for the month was \$36,443.91. It was moved by Mike and seconded by Keith to accept her report. All approved.

Board of Worship and Music: Pastor Soli and Harris reported that arrangements are being made for substitute musicians during Ruth's leave of absence.

Board of Stewardship and Social Ministry: Keith reported that the stewardship drive ended with favorable results. There was an increase in the number of pledges from 101 to 105 and also an increase in the amount pledged. Time and talent sheets are being tabulated.

Board of Education: There was no report. Allison reminded the Council of the Sunday School Christmas Program and the birthday party for Jesus, both scheduled in December.

Board of Youth: Karla reported that they have not met but plans are being made to continue with the Fifth Quarter events.

Board of Life and Growth:
No report.

Board of Property and Management: Written notes from their meeting were submitted in Steve's absence. The new floor polisher is in use. They will look for more bids on a door locking system. Pastor's Report: Pastor Soli reported that the meetings concerning the confidential questionnaire went well. He will have conversations with the Bishop regarding his interim work at Salem. He will soon have a rough outline for the goals he would like the congregation to work toward next year. Melinda has returned from her medical leave and they are working to sort out each person's responsibilities. **Minutes continued...**

Dec. Council Minutes Continued

It was moved by Deb and seconded by Allison to accept these reports. All approved.

Old Business: There was no old business.

New Business: There were no visitors. Harris reminded the Council of the annual meeting on January 25, 2015. There will be one service that Sunday at 9:30, followed by a meal, and the meeting. Delegates to the Synod Assembly will be included on the ballot. Helen would like information for reports by January 7. Salem has received a bequest from the Judy Colby estate in the amount of \$2834.22. It was moved by Keith and seconded by Mike to give half of that amount to the Good Samaritan Fund and half to the Lake Mills Food Bank. All approved. Melinda McCluskey has accepted and signed her contract. Her paperwork has been returned from the Synod. It was moved by Scott and seconded by Mike to set her start date at December 15. Arrangements will soon be made to get a Call Committee organized. Names of possible members would be suggested by the congregation and voted on at the Annual Meeting. They will work with the Transition Team to develop a mission profile for Salem. The Council is working to make the position of the Church Secretary comparable with other similar positions in Lake Mills. In that effort, \$1700 would be added to that yearly salary in January and reviewed in July 2015. It would be

allocated between salary or retirement benefits as the employee wishes. A motion to that effect was made by Scott and seconded by Keith. All approved. \$5800 was received from the Enduring Gift Fund and used to purchase new vacuum cleaners and a floor scrubber/polisher. It was moved by Scott and seconded by Keith to adjourn the meeting. All approved. The next Council meeting will be on January 12, 2015. The Council then attended a presentation by Pastor Soli regarding the roles of tradition and innovation in the congregation.



Call Committee to be elected at Annual Meeting

One item on the agenda for this year's Annual Meeting will be the election of a seven member Call Committee. The Call Committee will begin its work early this year as they will coordinate their efforts with the Transition Team and Church Council. Pr. Soli will provide leadership so that in helping the full congregation identify a vision and plan for the future. A key part of this plan will be the new lead pastor.



The Church Council will be asking congregational members to nominate up to three people to serve on the Call Committee. The Council is looking to balance the Call Committee with members that include: both younger and older, male and female,

those who might favor traditional worship and contemporary worship, as well as both longtime and newer members to the congregation. The Council will receive the nominations, develop a slate of candidates for election, and put these names into nomination at the Annual Meeting. The congregation will vote to make the final decision on who will represent the congregation in the call process.

Members are encouraged to pray about these nominations and to be open to serving on the Call Committee if asked. Members are also encouraged to place their own name into nomination if they feel lead to do so.

Eventually the Call Committee will be meeting with pastoral candidates, conducting interviews, and representing the congregation to the candidates. The Call Committee will select one person and recommend that pastor first to the Church Council and the Council will vote to recommend the candidate to the congregation. Finally, the congregation will be asked to vote on the recommended candidate. To be successful, the candidate must receive a two thirds majority of those present and voting.
